90% or more out of maximum points – the answer and reasoning are right and thorough, right concepts have been used

80% of maximum points – the answer and reasoning are right but lack the in-depth insight into the problem, there are some errors in using the right concepts 70% of maximum points – the answer is right, includes promising reasoning, but it remains predominantly superficial (reasoning is short and/or confusing) and lacks the in-depth insight into the problem

60% of maximum points – the answer is only partly right, includes short and superficial but promising reasoning 50% of maximum points – the answer is only partly right and the reasoning is poor and predominantly wrong
